


Both book sale events will take place in the Community Room of the Hughes. Hope to see you there!

Donations can be dropped off Thursday, Friday and Saturday only, at the Hughes Library circulation desk in Stroudsburg during normal business hours. No encyclopedias, textbooks, magazines, audio cassettes, VHS tapes or poor condition items will be accepted.

Books will be sold at our Friends Book Stores located in the Hughes and Middle Smithfield Library branches and at our Annual Book Sale. All proceeds from these books are used to benefit the Eastern Monroe Public Libraries. Books may also be purchased online at Alibris.
