**Treasurer's Report** – J. Morganthau observed that the county taxes are coming in slowly. M. Liberman questioned the figure representing the Ioannidis fund. It should be \$20,000 a year, not \$200,000. B. Keiser commented on the fact that the Adult Collection is over budget because of start up costs for E-Book service. That will not continue.

The Board determined we need more current bids.

Hunter & Sons Electric proposed a bid of \$800.00 to do the outside lighting of the Hughes sign at night. The cost includes \$500 for the fixture and \$300 for labor.

## ML/JM moved to approve Hunter & Sons' bid for \$800.00. Carried.

**Publicity & Community Relations** – A. Stevens-Arroyo suggested the Board prepare a script to emphasize that the cost of the new Smithfield building would be coming from grant money, not tax money. He mentioned the possibility of a press release to the Pocono Record. Also, along with M. Erm, A. Stevens-Arroyo organized two activities on Sat.
